- 00:07 Developed in consultation with researchers and those who support them, the RDF 2025 has a reconfigured framework which puts researchers at its centre.
- 00:17 This foregrounds the individual as the new entry point and recognises people as the key to thriving positive research cultures.
- 00:27 While this emphasis on individual agency is important, we also know that solving complex research problems and challenges requires people from different fields to work together, bringing a wide range of skills and experiences.
- 00:39 That's why the updated Research Communities domain encompasses all other areas of the framework, highlighting the nature of research as a shared endeavour.
- 00:48 The revised structure also reflects the importance of inclusive teams, effective team working and researchers who can work across communities and sectors.
- 00:56 In this sense, the updated framework provides a holistic picture of your potential development as a researcher.
- 01:01 Not only does it focus on core skills such as being adaptable, reflexive and responsible, but it also maps the skills and behaviours required to work with the teams and partners that are key to the success of research.
